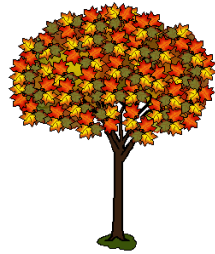

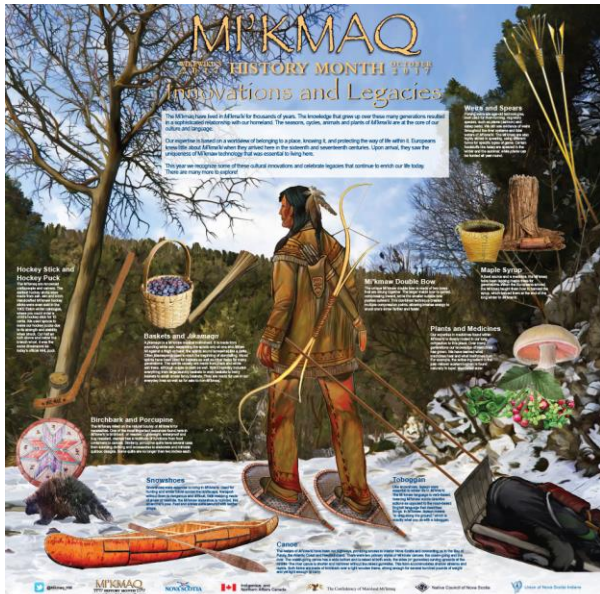

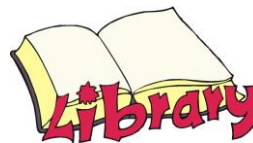

### Safety Drills

Throughout the school year students and staff will be practicing safety drills. A code red drill is an evacuation from the school (fire drill), a code black is evacuation and relocation from the school premises (Enfield Legion) and code blue is a lockdown of the school. From time to time all students and staff will be practicing these drills. School Administration work closely with staff, the Enfield Fire Department and the RCMP to ensure the safety drills follow safe procedures with everyone’s input.

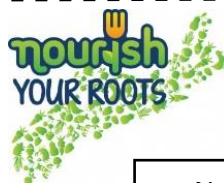

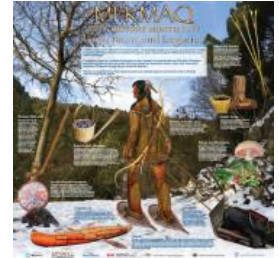
## Nourish Your Roots Fundraiser
